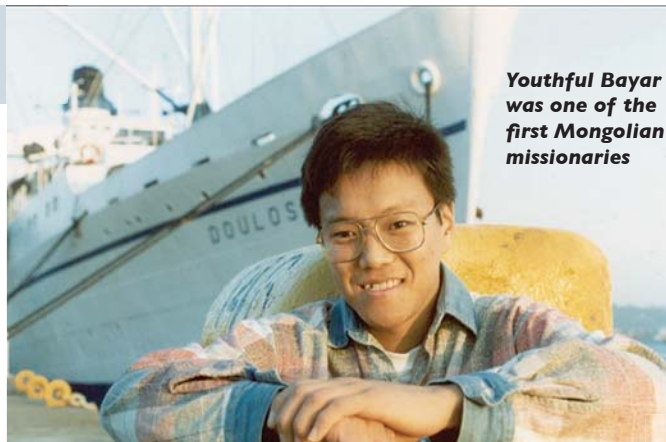

Youthful Bayar was one of the first Mongolian missionaries

But our programmes, and all their intricate plans and growth paths, are actually just about people. **People like you and me; people with families, dreams and some fascinating ministries.** Let me tell you about two Langham Scholars from two of those more "exotic places" – CHAD and MONGOLIA: Abel Ngarsoulede and Bayar Garamtseren, to be a little more personal (*the YouTubes for this letter will give you an even more personal insight*).

Abel is a tall, slender and a softly spoken leader with a Central-African French accent who just happens to lead a huge church in N'djamena, Chad's capital. His abiding memory as a **young boy was watching his pastor being buried alive** by villagers from an indigenous movement keen to see a resurgence of the ancient religion of their forefathers.

His pastor's resistance to this cultural pressure to follow local animistic religious practices was something that Abel knew, even as a young boy, would mean that the way of Christ can have a very high price attached to it. **But the experience did not make him bitter.** As an adult Christian he was asked by his government to help broker peace with the rebels who were destabilising Chad from 2005-2008. A man who knew the sweet pain of forgiveness was needed once again.

To some extent Bayar is not all that different. **As the first missionary from the new churches of Mongolia** he was able to cut his teeth on some very practical ways of reaching across cultures around the world whilst travelling on the Doulos ship with Operation Mobilisation. In 1989 there were 4 Christians in the whole of Mongolia and now the number of Christians has grown to approximately 25,000 living in the nation's

capital of Ulaanbaatar alone. That is 2.5% of the people living in that strategic city.

When Bayar returned home from his international travels his nation had changed rapidly and the **gospel was a major catalyst in that post-Communism** transition. And Bayar is one of a team ensuring that that growth is matched by a Bible in the language that the people understand.

Would you consider supporting men and women like Abel and Bayar? **£25 is needed each day to cover tuition fees alone.** If you are able to go even further and take out a standing order we'll be able to commit to many more scholars in the future.

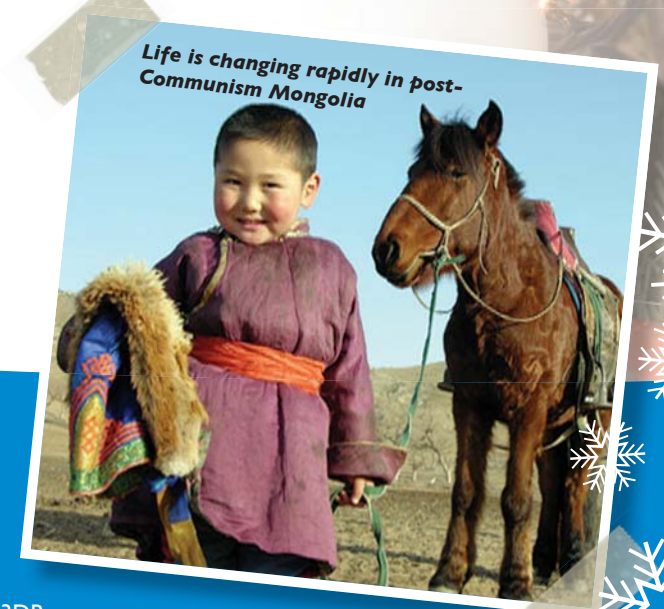
